How does Council contribute to the operations of Kingston Community School Library Services?



Your Council provides services to support the way you and other members of your community in the way you live, work and play. Councils care for communities. They consult widely on their plans and programs. Services can vary greatly from one council to another – some need to look after beaches, some provide walking and cycle tracks and some communities highly value a local swimming centre – others have different needs and priorities.

School Community Libraries were established in 1975 to provide a public library service in rural and remote communities with populations of less than 5,000.
