

THE COORONG

The long stretch of beach which spans from Kingston to the Murray Mouth is known as the Coorong. It is a distance of almost 200km. Species found along this stretch of coast are School Shark, Mulloway, Whiting, Snapper, Flathead, Salmon, Mullet, Rays and Sting Rays. They are all caught using a variety of bait, fresh and frozen, or lures and poppers. The holy grail of these fish is the Mulloway and can be caught up to 90 pounds and 6 foot long! This stretch of beach is also well known as a tourist destination, because of the amazing rock formations known as the Granites, situated 20km north of Kingston.

SAFE DRIVING

The coastal dune systems are dynamic and constantly changing - be aware of soft, shifting sands and blowouts. Adverse weather conditions such as high tides and storms may cause sections of the beach to become treacherous. Always check local conditions & tide times.
