

CAPE JAFFA MARINA BOAT RAMP

Kingston District Council provides a boat ramp located at Cape Jaffa. Launch Permits must be displayed at all times when using the boat ramp.

Daily Launch Permit Fee - \$10.00 inc GST
Annual Launch Permit Fee - \$100.00 inc GST

Annual permits are available from the Council Office, 29 Holland Street or Kingston Foreshore Caravan Park, 34A Marine Parade.

Daily permits are available at the boat ramp via the onsite ticket machine (coin or card only).

Accessibility of these facilities is subject to weather and environmental conditions. Please phone the Council office on 08 8767 2033 to check if the facilities are currently open.

Conditions of use:

1. The Annual Permit is valid from the date of purchase to 30 June 2020.
2. The permit fee is calculated using the permit fee determined by the Kingston District Council.
3. The permit tag must be displayed near the winch of the registered boat trailer.
4. Permits must be provided to Council authorised officers on request.
5. Launching and Retrieving of boats is at the owner's risk.
6. Permits are non-refundable

KINGSTON FISHING

The jetty and groyne (to the north of the jetty) is a haven for a variety of bait fish which can be good on the table or used for bait to catch the big one that swims by. A huge range of species to be caught such as Tommy Rough, Mullet, Trevally, Bream, Whiting, Flat Head, Salmon, Squid, Garfish or chase the big Mulloway or Sharks (School, Gummy, Bronze, Carpet). Smaller species may be caught throughout the majority of the year with the bigger fish coming through from October onwards.



CAPE JAFFA FISHING

The Cape Jaffa Anchorage Development provides a wonderful safe, well-stocked home for a vast variety of fish. With rockwalls collecting food for the fish to feed on there is plenty to be caught such as Bream, Flathead, Whiting, Mullet, Salmon, Garfish, Tommy Rough, Squid and Trevally. It is a wonderful place to take the kids and enjoy a day of fishing. It offers protection from the sea breeze, and has two man-made beaches where you can enjoy dipping your feet and getting wet.

THE COORONG



The long stretch of beach which spans from Kingston to the Murray Mouth is known as the Coorong. It is a distance of almost 200km.

Species found along this stretch of coast are School Shark, Mulloway, Whiting, Snapper, Flathead, Salmon, Mullet, Rays and Sting Rays.

They are all caught using a variety of bait, fresh and frozen, or lures and poppers. The holy grail of these fish is the Mulloway and can be caught up to 90 pounds and 6 foot long! This stretch of beach is also well known as a tourist destination, because of the amazing rock formations known as the Granites, situated 20km north of Kingston.

SAFE DRIVING



The coastal dune systems are dynamic and constantly changing - be aware of soft, shifting sands and blowouts. Adverse weather conditions such as high tides and storms may cause sections of the beach to become treacherous. Always check local conditions & tide times.

KINGSTON TO CAPE JAFFA BEACH

This really is the beach to get away from everyone. The beach is roughly 20km long and easily accessible during the summer months in a car, and all year round via 4WD.

There are ample clear waters in a protected bay, which is beautiful for fishing, swimming and a variety of water activities. People wanting to relax and have a quiet fish should visit this beach. Fish to aim for include Whiting, Flathead, Flounder, Tommy Rough, Leather Jackets, Garfish and Salmon to name a few. A beautiful beach for family and friends.
